- A pretty ribbon or other decoration is always nice as well

## SPOTLIGHT Mary Sciuto

Mary was born in The Bronx and lived there until she was 6, when her family moved to Miami. After school, she went to work mostly in the bookkeeping/accounting field and met her husband Al (the love of her life) in 1962 at a USO dance at Homestead Air Force Base. Two years later, they got hitched and have been happily married for 52 years.

Mary is a longtime member of HWC - 25 years to be exact, and has been an enormous contributor to the club. She's served on the Board and on numerous committees but the highlight was in 1996 when she co-chaired the Ways & Means Committee with Pam Collins, publishing the club's first and only cookbook called "Quite Simply . . . Delicious". It was very successful thanks to their very hard working committee. As a resident of Heathrow since 1989, she has also been active in the Heathrow community as well, as a member of the Community Relations Committee (Funival/Music in the Park), Covenant Compliance Committee, Heathrow Country Club social committee and she remains a Regency Green Board Member.



Prior to Heathrow, she was the first president and member of the Winter Springs La Sertoma Club (Ladies in Service to Mankind) from 1977-1995, a small club with a large impact on the community. As you can see, Mary is no wallflower, having spent a lot of her life enriching many.

After several years in the Miami area, she and Al moved to New Jersey for a job opportunity, but after a year, they missed Florida and relocated to Orlando. In 1976, they started Special Editions Publishing, Inc., with Al running the company and Mary doing the bookwork. At one time their company published more than 30 different publications including the Florida Citrus Bowl game day programs, four publications for the Performing Arts and more recently "Success in Seminole" and "Excellence in Seminole". Twice a year, they published "The Milk Story Coloring Books". They retired 3 years ago.

Fortunately, she and Al have been able to travel quite a bit. They took a big trip to Europe in years past and have traveled extensively throughout the US, including many national parks.

Mary plays doubles tennis and was on the winning W.A.I.T. league teams in the 80's and 90's. She walks 2 miles a day with her dear Siberian Husky, Bella, who they happily rescued. They are great dog lovers. She and some of her friends formed a biking group called "The Heathrow Biker Chicks", who planted a tree in the group's honor, on the trail. She also works out and they both love sports - football, tennis and golf, and remain big Miami Dolphin fans.

Mary always greets you with a smile and a hug - she is happy and feels blessed to be part of the Heathrow community and our club. In return, she gives back in spades... yet another lady that makes our wonderful club prosper.
