She says she had a happy, uneventful childhood in the suburbs. Perhaps her mother's gift of gab led Maureen to aspire to be a radio disc jockey when she first studied at the University of New Haven. But practicality won out when she transferred to Norwalk Community College and studied business and finance.

Tony is Italian, but grew up near Cannes, France. Over the years, he, Maureen and the boys have visited relatives many times. Although Maureen says she cannot really speak French or Italian, she is able to follow along through mutual good humor. She and Tony are planning a trip to visit family in 2019 and this time they will also visit Paris for a few days.

When not working or enjoying her family, Maureen goes to New Smyrna Beach as often as she can. There she walks, reads, and just relaxes. She aspires to live close to the beach when she retires. COMMITTEE DESCRIPTIONS

Charitable Endeavors: responsible for coordinating volunteer activities and distributing funds raised by the club to our selected charities.

Communications: responsible for the club's website, newsletter and social media (Facebook). Computer training is available to anyone interested in being on this committee.

Finance: responsible for staffing the registration table at our luncheon.

Focus: responsible for conducting our annual satisfaction survey as well as keeping updated records of job descriptions for the Executive Board and Standing Committee Chairs. The committee also maintains the club bylaws, and the policies and procedures.

Hospitality: responsible for welcoming new members and familiarize them with club and our activities. This can include, but is not limited to, bringing new members to meetings, sitting with new members at the luncheon and introducing them to other members who may have similar interests. This committee also hosts two "new member get-togethers" a year. Must be an HWC member for one year to join this committee.

summer months, the committee will begin meeting prior to the end of the previous fiscal year.

Public Relations: responsible for promoting the club's activities via community based electronic signage and print materials. This includes writing and sending press releases and photographing club events. Other tasks that fall under Public Relations include but are not limited to: writing articles for the Heathrow Living Magazine and member Spotlight articles.

Social: responsible for organizing social activities and events for HWC members and when appropriate for their adult guests as well. Some activities include: Bridge, Bunco, Dine Around, Book Club, Progressive Dinner, Happy Hour Social and much, much more.

Membership: responsible for answering questions from prospective members about the club and registering new members at the luncheons.

Ways & Means: responsible for planning and implementing the fundraising efforts of the club, including Club Sponsorships. Members are encouraged to participate in a variety of activities throughout the year; i.e. Annual Golf Tournament, Bake Sale, Yard Sale, Purse Auction, Major Spring Benefit and more.
