Lava Cake:

6 oz melted butter
6 oz melted semi-sweet chocolate (4oz melted chocolate and 2 oz Godiva Chocolate Liqueur)
¼ cup of sugar
2 tablespoons of flour
2 eggs
2 yolks

*mix all ingredients, except the chocolate, in a mixing bowl and thoroughly combine. Add the chocolate and fold into the mixture until thoroughly combined.

Chocolate Ganache:

3 oz of melted chocolate
2 oz of heavy cream

*combine all ingredients in mixing bowl and mix until thoroughly combined.

Fresh Fruit Compote:

6 blueberries
6 raspberries
6 blackberries
1 oz hot water
2 oz sugar
2 oz honey

*add sugar and honey to mixing bowl, then add the hot water and mix until sugar is dissolved. Add the fruit and toss in mixture until the fruit is completely covered.

Whipped Cream:

1 cup heavy cream
¼ cup of powdered sugar
1 teaspoon of vanilla (imitation or extract)

*combine all ingredients in a mixer and mix until ingredients are thick.

SPOTLIGHT *Carol King*

Carol King is one of the few “true Florida natives” that I have had the pleasure to interview for this Spotlight article. She was born and raised in the small Victorian town of McIntosh, FL (founded 1890), located between Ocala and Gainesville. Her father was also a Florida native who loved fishing and boating on nearby Orange Lake. And, that is where he met Carol’s mother, a citizen of Scotland (from near Rosslyn Chapel, of *The Da Vinci Code* fame) who was visiting Florida with some friends when they took a boating excursion...and the rest is history. Carol and her sister grew up enjoying the unspoiled nature of old Florida while going to schools in Gainesville. Her father worked for the school board and later owned a plumbing business and her mother was a Registered Nurse providing critical care in the ICU. Although her dad has passed, her mother lives in Gainesville and only recently retired a few months before her 80th birthday. Carol’s sister still resides in Gainesville with her family which includes three children.

Inspired by her mother, providing care comes naturally to Carol, who now supports “the families” at Oakmonte Village as the Director of Sales for the assisted living and memory care facilities. Although she grew up in northern Florida, she moved to Orlando to attend UCF, graduating with a degree in Journalism in the Advertising/Public Relations track. She married young and had a son, who is now 23. He has recently moved back to Orlando, from Georgia, after playing football for Georgia Southern University. Carol spent his formative years raising her son and then went into the workforce in sales and account management for VS Media Group, an advertising agency focused on local Orlando businesses and the tourism business. Carol met her second husband, Darrell King, through mutual friends. Darrell’s daughter is the same age as Carol’s son, so that helped complete their family.

As we know, it is always “who you know” that opens doors. A friend of hers was working at Oakmonte Village and made a referral for Carol. She got the job in 2014! She says that she finds her work challenging and rewarding and draws on her personal experience with her aging parents.

Now that the children are grown, Carol and her husband are planning to travel. Both Italy and Germany are on their bucket list. She also enjoys reading and watching *Victoria* on Masterpiece on PBS.

summer months, the committee will begin meeting prior to the end of the previous fiscal year.

Public Relations: responsible for promoting the club's activities via community based electronic signage and print materials. This includes writing and sending press releases and photographing club events. Other tasks that fall under Public Relations include but are not limited to: writing articles for the Heathrow Living Magazine and member Spotlight articles.

Social: responsible for organizing social activities and events for HWC members and when appropriate for their adult guests as well. Some activities include: Bridge, Bunco, Dine Around, Book Club, Progressive Dinner, Happy Hour Social and much, much more.

Membership: responsible for answering questions from prospective members about the club and registering new members at the luncheons.

Ways & Means: responsible for planning and implementing the fundraising efforts of the club, including Club Sponsorships. Members are encouraged to participate in a variety of activities throughout the year; i.e. Annual Golf Tournament, Bake Sale, Yard Sale, Purse Auction, Major Spring Benefit and more.
