PRIMARY FOCUSES FOR THE 2019-2020 YEAR

We have identified specific areas in which we will create more member engagement and work toward overall satisfaction.

COMMUNICATION - To help members more fully understand the HWC traditions, programs, and initiatives. Specific examples include:

- The complete [annual membership survey results](#) are posted on the heathrowwomensclub.com web site under the MEMBERSHIP tab. This password protected segment is open only for current members under the PASSWORD: HWCsurvey2019. Check it out!
- Board meeting and luncheon minutes to be easily accessible on the website.
- A "How To" for each event and activity will be created. This will allow easy reference for members and consistent transition from year-to-year.
- Decision-making steps/timing will be shared, in multiple ways, regarding how we select our charities and how monies are distributed.

ENGAGEMENT - To encourage our members to value their HWC membership and become more engaged with our activities—social and fundraising. This is the foundation for membership retention, growth, and ensuring the club is valuable to members.

- Our luncheons will be more interactive, encouraging lively discussions and hopefully creating interest and enthusiastic participation in upcoming social activities and fundraising events.
- Consider sitting with new folks at the luncheons to expand your friendships within the club. Our Board members will be joining the tables throughout the room - ask them questions; offer them your ideas and suggestions; consider filling these Board positions next year!

“WHY IS IT THAT WE....?”

I have been asked a variation of this question throughout the summer! As I learn the “*hows and whys*” of my role as your president, I will share this information with you. Please send me your questions (mundane, significant, humorous, or aspirational). Here are four of the questions I have received regarding luncheon meetings and answers. I will move on to more weighty questions going forward!

- Why do we alternate between buffets and plated meals at the luncheons? It’s clear our members have differing opinions on menu selection, types of service, etc. This alternating plan accommodates most of our members’ preferences. If you need any assistance with serving the buffet, please let the ladies at the Membership/Hospitality table know. We will have a member from Hospitality assist you.
- Why have the rolls at the luncheon changed to those little triangle shaped rolls? The Heathrow Country Club has buying commitments to their restaurant supply company and will only serve these rolls at all of their events. They are called “sista rolls” - appropriate for our group of sistas, right??
- Why are there often two tables in the back of the room with no setups (salads, beverages)? The Country Club sets up these tables to accommodate late arriving members. Please do NOT sit at them unless you meet this criterion! (It incurs additional cost for the club and slows down overall service, if they end up being used.)
- Why do our luncheons cost \$25 per person? The Country Club is keeping our luncheon price the same this year, when many local venues are raising their banquet pricing. With plated luncheons we get 2 entrée choices, where most banquet venues will only provide one. And, buffets are actually more expensive due to the unlimited portion sizes and wasted food that often occurs. This is not a restaurant service; it is a banquet service. The per person price covers: the food, the beverages (unlimited), the cost of the ballroom and foyer space and its cleaning (including bathrooms), linens, table set up/breakdown, dish service and washing, audio-visual equipment, serving staff, chef and kitchen staff, banquet manager, and a service charge (22%) for wait and kitchen staff.

I am looking forward to this exciting new season, meeting so many new friends, AND supporting our local charities.

A Senior Moment or Something More? Know the Signs

As our brains age, it's normal to briefly forget the day of the week or struggle a bit to find the right word. For some people, changes in their brain's ability to function as it used to may signal the onset of a dementia-related illness such as Alzheimer's disease.

Alzheimer's Symptoms to Watch For

The Alzheimer's Association lists the following warning signs and symptoms of a memory disorder:

1. **Difficulty Completing Familiar Tasks:** If you have difficulty driving to a familiar place or remembering the rules of a favorite game, consider seeing a doctor.
2. **Confusion About Time or Places:** Losing track of dates, seasons and the passage of time. Includes having trouble understanding something if it's not happening right now.
3. **Trouble Understanding Images and Spatial Relationships:** Alzheimer's may cause difficulty reading, judging distance or determining color. This can cause problems with driving.
4. **New Problems with Speaking or Writing:** Trouble following or joining conversation. They may stop talking and have no idea how to continue or call things by the wrong name (e.g., calling a watch a hand-clock).
5. **Misplacing Things:** Putting things in unusual places and be unable to retrace their steps to find them.
6. **Decreased or Poor Judgment:** A person with Alzheimer's may give large amounts of money to telemarketers or pay less attention to grooming.

Christine's Safe Pet Fund is an ongoing fund that has been established in memory of our Past President, and friend, Christine Gillen.

Christine's Safe Pet Fund will enable more domestic violence victims to leave abusive households without leaving their pets behind and at risk. Christine's Fund will celebrate the human animal bond and how family pets can provide comfort, reassurance, and healing to Seminole County women and children survivors.

Did you know that 65% of domestic violence victims will delay or refuse to leave an abusive home out of fear of leaving their pets behind?

Did you know that up to 85% of women entering domestic violence shelters reported that their partner had threatened, injured, or killed their pet?

The monies raised will be used for vaccinations, shots, medications, food, and pet housing deposits. Christine's Safe Pet Fund will help to remove barriers to safety and allow survivors with pets to seek safety together thus saving more lives!
