We also welcomed a new organization this year to our charitable endeavors. The Foundation for Seminole County schools. I am so proud of our ladies who have worked so hard and given of their time and talents to make this year so very successful. From the golf tournament to the yard sale and following up with Caribbean Paradise-A Night in the Tropics we had such a fun and successful year. Many of us continue to give to the Circle of Giving, our ongoing donation campaign, and we started Christine's Safe Pet Fund in memory of our Past President, Christine Gillen. Christine's Safe Pet Fund will enable more domestic violence victims to leave abusive households without leaving their pets behind and at risk. Christine's fund will celebrate the human animal bond and how family pets can provide comfort, reassurance, and healing to Seminole County adult and children survivors. Did you know that 65% of domestic violence victims will delay or refuse to leave an abusive home out of fear of leaving their pets behind? Did you know that up to 85% of women entering domestic violence shelters reported that their partner had threatened, injured, or killed their pet? The monies raised will be used for vaccinations, shots, medications, food and pet housing deposits. Christine's Safe Pet Fund will help to remove barriers to safety and allow survivors with pets to seek safety together thus saving more lives! 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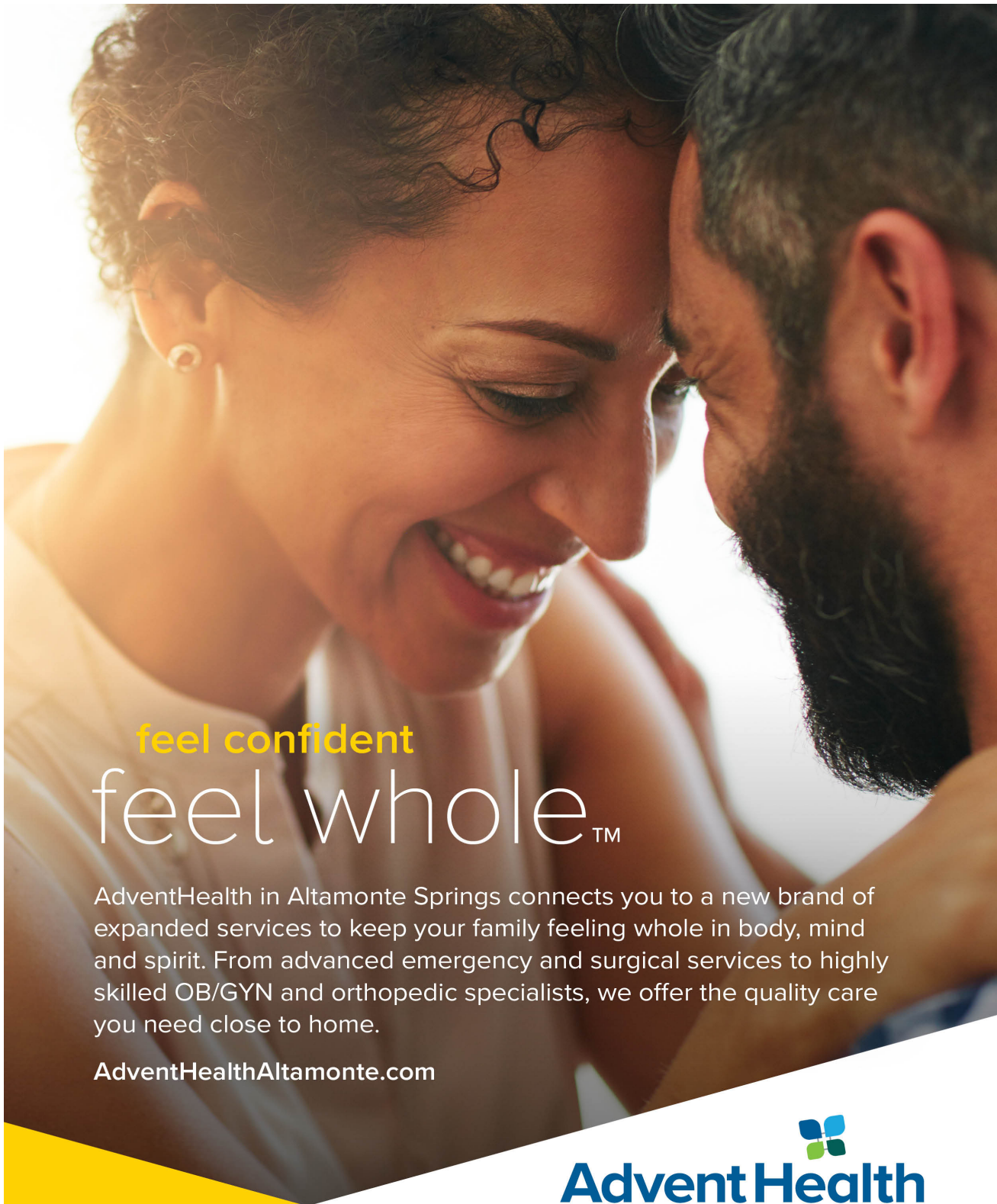
